The Current Situation in Kent


15 confirmed cases in our region.

One Year 13 student at our school is expected to be discharged from hospital shortly.




Health experts (UKHSA) confirm the risk to the wider school community is **very low**.

The Science: What Exactly is Meningitis?



Meningitis simply means the protective membranes surrounding the brain and spinal cord have become infected and swollen.



It can affect anyone, but when treated quickly by doctors, the bacteria can be destroyed.

How the Bacteria Moves



The Source

The bacteria live in the nose and throat of people who often aren't even sick themselves.


The Transmission

It spreads through prolonged, close personal contact, coughing, sneezing, or sharing fluids.

The Reassurance

It is not as easily caught as a common cold or COVID-19.


Spotting the Signs

The Glass Test


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
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Safe




Warning

If a rash appears, press a clear glass against it. If it does not fade, seek immediate medical help.

The rash does not always appear. Never wait for a rash to get help if you have other severe symptoms.

Your Action Plan: If You Feel Unwell



Don't wait. It is always better to be safe.

The Power of Community



Meningitis acts fast, and someone who is sick might become too confused or drowsy to ask for help themselves.

Your Job: Look out for your mates. If your friend seems unusually confused, sick, or cannot stay **awake, tell an adult for them immediately.**

How the NHS Fights Back



Modern medicine is highly effective. The NHS uses rapid antibiotics and fluids delivered directly into a vein to destroy the bacteria.



Public Health teams trace close contacts (like the queues seen at the university) and provide preventative antibiotic tablets to stop the bacteria from spreading further.

Your Protective Toolkit

- ✓ Wash your hands regularly with soap and water.
- ✓ Cough or sneeze into a tissue or your sleeve.
- ✓ Do not share water bottles, food, or lip balm with anyone.
- ✓ Check your vaccines. (The MenACWY vaccine is routinely offered to teenagers around 14 years old (school year 9 or 10) to build immunity—ask your parents if you are up to date!).
