# **Curriculum Intent**

#### **Curriculum Vision - Drama**

The content of Drama is what it means to be human. Students study Drama to develop their emotional intelligence and ability to empathise with a range of human experiences outside of their own. From the first lesson in Year 7 where students are looking at their first day at Primary School in comparison with their first day in Secondary School, our students are challenged to make comparison between their own experiences and the lives of others. As they move through the curriculum our students encounter roles from different cultures and historical periods and are guided to find a connection with them. As they move into KS4 and KS5, students are challenged to engage with and interpret characters from dramatic texts across theatrical history. Allied to the content, our students are equipped with the dramatic techniques to communicate a role and create dramatic work, from learning the effect of emphasis in a line in Year 7 to the distancing techniques of Epic Theatre in Year 12. Regardless of whether students pursue a career in the Performing Arts or not, I want out students to leave the course with increased self-confidence and a keen awareness of how they can present themselves to the world to create the most favourable impression.


### All students
