


Sanctions

- The vast majority of our students are well behaved and are enthusiastic about their learning.
- We have high expectations of our students, and our behaviour policy reflects this.
- Pupils are helped to take responsibility for their actions.
- Families are involved in behaviour incidents to foster good relationships between the school and pupils' home life. When a student receives a sanction/detention the parent will be informed via an email about the details of why that young person has a detention.
- Following a trial in Term 6 last year we have now incorporated automatic centralised L1 detentions within 24 Hours of the incident happening.

How can you support your son through their

PPE REVISION



Step 1: Figure out how much time they have to revise.

- Start by making a list of all of their GCSE exams and their dates.
- Then, estimate how much time you have to revise in total.
- This will help them to set realistic goals for their revision plan.



Step 2:

Prioritise their subjects/topics.

- Once you know how much time they have to revise, they need to decide which subjects/topics you need to focus on the most.
- Consider their strengths and weaknesses in each subject, as well as the importance of each subject in their overall GCSE performance.
- You may also want to consider their career goals and which subjects are most relevant to your chosen path.



Step 3:

Break subjects into topics.

- Once they have prioritised your subjects/topics, they need to break them down into smaller chunks.
- This will make it easier to plan their revision and to track their progress.
- For example, they could break down the subject of English into topics such as grammar, punctuation, comprehension, and essay writing.



Step 4:

Allocate 30-minute time slots to revise.

- Once they have broken down your subjects/topics, they need to allocate
 30-minute time slots to revise each one.
- This will help them to stay focused and to avoid getting overwhelmed.
- They may also want to factor in some breaks into their revision plan.



Step 5:

What to do within each revision session?

- During each revision session, they should focus on one specific topic.
- They could read through your notes, make flashcards, or practice answering questions.
- They may also want to use online resources or get help from a tutor.



Step 6:

Review your progress regularly.

- It is important to review their progress regularly to make sure that they are on track.
- They could do this by taking practice exams, reviewing their notes, or asking your teacher for feedback.
- If they are not making progress, they may need to adjust their revision plan.



Step 7:

Take breaks and reward them.

- It is important to take breaks during their revision sessions and to reward themselves for their hard work.
- This will help them to stay motivated and to avoid burnout.
- They could take a short walk, listen to some music, or watch a funny video.



Step 8:

Stay positive and don't give up.

- Revision can be tough, but it is important to stay positive and to not give up.
- Remember why they are revising and what they are working towards.
- If they stay focused and motivated, they will be successful in your GCSE exams.

Additional tips for creating a revision plan:

- Start early. The earlier you start revising, the more time they will have to cover all of the material.
- Find a quiet place to revise where they will not be interrupted.
- Make sure that you have all of the resources you need, such as textbooks, notes, and practice exams.
- Take breaks regularly to avoid getting overwhelmed.
- Reward themselves for their hard work.
- Stay positive and don't give up!

How can you support your son



- 1. Access Satchel One on a regular basis
- 2. Have discussions regarding upcoming monitoring deadlines
- 3. If possible, provide a dedicated workspace at home
- 4. Attend parents evening (T3)
- 5. Ask for help from us if it is needed
- 6. Set out clear expectations at home
- 7. Support the need for additional work for all subjects outside lessons

How can you support your son



- 8. Ensure your son/daughter does not participate in more that 8 hours paid work a week
- 9. Students are not allowed to work during school hours
- 10. Support enrichment activities and any work experience
- 11. Talk to them/ Challenge them
- 12. Become an involved member of the school community.



During the parents' presentation evening many of you have queried which examination boards and papers your son(s) will be sitting this summer. To aid you in your understanding of the examinations I have produced a table that details every subject and the accompanying examination board for every Year 10 and 11 student at The Norton Knatchbull School.

I cannot reiterate enough the importance of examination preparation. All too often students omit examination question practise from their revision, but I hope you agree that the key to examination success is practice. All the subject teachers and myself, along with your son's SSM, will continue to encourage and support all students to use a wide range of revision techniques so they are fully prepared.

Lastly the school has also invested in GCSEPod for the students to use. This is a powerful 21st century learning tool based on "Pods". Each one is a highly concentrated, 3-5 minute burst of audio-visual learning and specialist subject knowledge for 25 curriculum areas. It's written by expert subject teachers and will support students in their revision and classwork.
