The Mission Statement was written by our student leaders in 2019 and reflects the values and qualities which inspire young people in the 21st century – linking with and resonating with the motto of the school - Benefactorum Recordatio Jucundissima Est, "Things done well make the best memories" – the words of the school's founder, Sir Norton Knatchbull in 1637.

Our approach is underpinned by The Knatchbull Baccalaureate, which comprises of four key elements.

- Academic study
- Enrichment
- Community and Leadership
- Extension and excellence

As students progress through school, they will be afforded opportunities in each of these areas, and colleagues will work to support, challenge and push our young people to achieve the best possible outcomes. This includes academic grades, but also more holistically in developing the qualities, skills and experiences necessary for life in the 21st century.

Alongside this there is one other commitment we will make – which is to care for you. Our staff – teaching and support, get to know our students more quickly and better than you might imagine.

What is the Pastoral team?



We are the Year 7 team and are very much looking forward to welcoming you here at NKS. Our role is to guide our students through their time in Year 7.

From embedding our students into the school and its routines; to then guiding them throughout their first year here, supporting students with their academic achievement and welfare needs.

We will be the first port of call for our students or yourselves, and available for any questions or matters that may arise during the year.

Mrs Parsonage oversees the pastoral welfare of the year group, whilst Mr Trafford covers the overall leadership of academic and pastoral development of our Year 7 Students.

Where can I get help?

At NKS there may be times when you need some help or support. We have a wide range of ways to provide that depending on what you or your child need help with.

If you have academic concerns, then we encourage students to speak to their teachers. Or alternatively having a quick chat with Mr Trafford (HOY) or Mrs Parsonage (SSM) will hopefully alleviate those concerns and allow us to ensure your child reaches their potential.

For pastoral concerns students are able to come to the Hub. This is a dedicated area where students are able to get support from their Student Support Managers (SSM). Should their SSM be unavailable as all the SSM's are located together then an SSM of another year group will be able to provide the support that they need. Our First Aid facility is also located in the Hub, so that students can get the help they need as quickly as possible.

For general concerns that your child is having they should start by talking to their Form Tutors. Each morning we have Form time from 08:45-09:00hrs. In these groups we have structured development tasks, which also gives your child the chance to bond with their form and their tutor as they will be on the seven-year journey to Year 13 together. Form groups will also compete in a range of House Competitions throughout the year. From sporting events, to Music and Drama, these allow the students in the form to bond and contribute to the overall House Cup Competition.

Woodworth (White)	Student (1904), Teacher, Headteacher, Governor (until 1979).



How will I be stretched and challenged?

We believe that students need to be stretched and challenged in order to achieve their academic potential. Therefore, we offer a range of academically focused additional support outside of the curriculum.

Our school Library allows students to extend their understanding of topics or explore topics they are interested in. Students are able to use this before school, at break and lunchtime plus it is also where our after-school homework club is located.

Students are able to push themselves in a range of leadership opportunities. Each form will have a Form and Deputy Form Captain, which are voted for during the first term of the school year. There are also roles which require students to represent their form in Year Group and Whole School Councils.

Our KS4 Knatch Bacc Lead, Mrs Dryland, organises a range of opportunities that focus on our Excel and Extend drive as well as driving aspiration and creativity through her work on our Super-Curriculum.



The Knatchbull Baccalaureate

The Knatchbull Baccalaureate encompasses four pillars:

Academic, Extra-curricular, Community and Leadership, Excel and Extend

Students are given the opportunity to record their achievements in each pillar. This provides students with an embedded stretch and challenge structure as they progress through the school.

The Academic pillar

This pillar is addressed through our curriculum. Students will have not only have assessment data which they can record, but also more personal achievements e.g. a run of excellent scores in low-stakes tests or an award for effort or achievement in a Celebration Assembly.

The Extra-Curricular pillar

Many of our students have full and balanced lives, including out-of-school activities which they will be able to record for this pillar. Some of our students like to join in lunchtime and after school groups and clubs held at NKS which can also be recorded under this pillar. To assist those who do not have access to out-of-school activities and may not wish to join in lunchtime and after school activities, we have a programme of extra-curricular challenges which can be completed at home. Evidence of these achievements can be shared with form tutors and lead towards bronze, silver and gold certificates.

The Community and Leadership pillar

Like the Extra-Curricular pillar, many students will serve their community through out-of-school activities and may hold leadership roles as they progress within these activities as well. There is a variety of opportunities for students to develop their leadership skills and community service throughout their time at NKS including leadership roles within the form group, raising money for charities and showing prospective students around the school during open mornings.

The Excel and Extend pillar

Students will record how they have stretched themselves in one of the above pillars. Examples of this could include reading a book which includes further information on a topic studied in school, reaching a particular level in an out-of-school activity or of the Extra-Curricular challenges or standing for form captain.

What will I study?

Whilst in Key Stage 3 students will explore a wide range of subjects. These provide students with the opportunity to deepen their understanding of core subjects, whilst also exploring the creative arts and sports.

When your child reaches KS4 and KS5 they will choose subjects they wish to take forward for their GCSEs and A Levels respectively. A series of Option Evenings and Assemblies ensure that your child makes the decision which is right for them.

How will I be rewarded?

At NKS we truly believe in rewarding our student's hard work and achievements. This ensure that students are rewarded for their hard work and that they feel valued for their contributions. Therefore, we recognise this in a variety of different ways to encompass as many different students as possible.

The first of these are Achievement Points. Students can earn these through a variety of ways, be it inside or outside of the classroom.

Twice a year we run Achievement Assemblies. Within these all teachers nominate students in each subject for Effort and Achievement prizes. This is combined with Head of Year prizes ranging from Attitude to Learning to support in the Library. This celebration culminates in our Prize Giving events occurring in Term 6 of each year.

Alongside these Celebration Assemblies we run a buffet where selected students are able to celebrate their hard work outside of the normal classroom setting. These are well attended, and the smell of pizza causes envious looks from across the school!

On top of this each Head of Year will run a variety of reward trips. As an example, this year we have taken a selection of Year 7 students to Hollywood Bowl and will be leading a fully paid for trip to Chessington for 25 lucky Year 7 Prize winners in June.



What does a school day look like?

The school site opens at 08:00, with form time at 08:45. Students in Year 7 to Year 9 finish at 15:15.

After school we run a free homework club that all students are able to attend until 16:30.

During the school day we have five, 60 minute lessons.

Year 7 to Year 9 lunch runs from 12:30-13:10.

During this time many of our students use our on-site caterers Cucina in our Knatch Hatch. A full dinner is on offer or alternatively a salad bar with some tasty snacks.
