Your son/daughter is about to start their non-examined assessment of the Geography course. This is a compulsory part of the course which contributes to 20% of their overall grade. This is a great opportunity for students to gain as many marks as possible before they go into the examinations at the end of the year and must be taken seriously. As part of this students must spend 5 days undertaking a fieldwork activities.

We will be meeting on the school site at 08:00 on the days that we are off site and be returning by 15:30. Students should meet myself and the trip staff in M3 on these days so that equipment can be distributed. Normal school timings will apply on the day that we are based in school (8th October).

While your son/daughter is undertaking the fieldwork activities in urban centres they will be remotely supervised so that as much data can be collected as possible. Students must stay in groups of at least 4 members for this time period. During these activates students will be given an emergency phone number which a member of staff on the trip will have access to at all times. For the coastal and sand dune studies, students will be supervised a lot closer in a ratio of no more than 1:9. For each of the days students are not required to wear sixth from uniform but should be wearing appropriate attire for the conditions. A packed lunch will also be required on each of the days.
